## Team Leaders at Nativity

During the past year, we have had continuing discussions about strategies for further improving the teaching model and the learning experience for both teachers and students. There is no question that our model has worked; the success of our students in schools and colleges beyond Nativity is tangible evidence. Still, we felt that as a school, we could do a better job of providing direction and support for our teaching fellows.

Beginning with the summer program, Nativity introduced the Team Leader concept, providing individual mentoring and direction by experienced classroom educators for our novice teaching fellows. In this model, Mr. Richard Finlaw serves as Team Leader for Grades 5 and 6, while Mrs. Katie Mannix is the Team Leader for Grades 7 and 8.

Richard and Katie serve not only as resources for our teaching fellows, but they also observe classes on a weekly basis and then invest time debriefing successful teaching techniques. They essentially serve as coaches, mentors, and counselors for the fellows, while also

overseeing the curriculum and the individual needs of the students in their respective grades.

This concept has provided great dividends so far, in that the teaching fellows have a direct resource to rely upon and trusted insight and support for further development of their teaching skills. In addition, Principal Jay Goldrick regularly observes classes and has been providing an opportunity for teaching fellows to review videotapes of their classes to assess their teaching style and identify their own strengths and areas for further development. At Nativity we are always trying to find ways to improve!



## Golf & Tennis

A longstanding event at Nativity Prep is the Annual Golf and Tennis Tournament in September—one of two annual fundraising events which support Nativity Preparatory School New Bedford. Over ten years, and with the help of a committee of twelve industrious and dedicated people, this event has raised \$500,000 for the school.

In the last seven years, this event has been hosted by The Bay Club at Mattapoisett and has seen enthusiastic support from its members. We see well over 100 golfers and tennis players participate each year. It's a

# Summer

This summer we further advanced the Nativity mission with the addition of an enhanced summer program. There is a long hyphen between the end of school in June and its start in September. As a result, summer vacation is not always a good thing for families in the inner city. Camp is not always an affordable option and vacations are rare, if they exist at all.

For that reason, we created Nativity Summer—three weeks of academic work supporting reading, language arts and mathematics, to strengthen and continue each student’s academic progress. This was on site in our school building’s newly air conditioned classrooms. Each day students had the opportunity to sail at the Community Boating Center or to enjoy a bike trip through Youth Opportunities Unlimited. All students benefited from both the academic and outdoor program and enjoyed a change of pace. When these Nativity Summer three weeks were concluded, each student had the opportunity to attend YMCA Camp Massasoit in Mattapoisett, Massachusetts for another three weeks!

This all-inclusive six week dynamic program of academics, athletics, and social integration successfully created the needed connection between one school year and the next. Next summer, we plan to add an arts component to round out the summer experience.

The results were very positive! When the school year began, our new teachers and new students were already part of our community. Our returning teachers and students were ready to learn and we initiated the new year without having to review material or assess student needs. Next summer will be even better!

# Walgreens Executive Inspires at Nativity

In May, Nativity had the privilege of hosting Mr. Steve Pemberton, Divisional Vice President and Chief Diversity Officer of the Walgreens company, at morning assembly, followed by a reception for invited guests. A New Bedford native, Mr. Pemberton is the author of *A Chance in the World*, describing his extraordinary difficulties growing up as a foster child and how he overcame many challenges to graduate from Boston College.

He talked to Nativity students about setting high expectations for themselves. In many ways, he said, Nativity students reminded him of his childhood self, "I see so much of myself in them—the idealism, the sense of possibility."

He told our students that when he was enduring early hardships he discovered that he had a "secret power." It was his extraordinary love of reading, he said. "I love reading. I write every day." He encouraged Nativity students to do the same. The students listened with rapt attention to this man from their city who had worked so hard, and despite some setbacks, achieved success.

After addressing the students, Mr. Pemberton met with Nativity trustees and friends of the school to talk further about his life as well as the effect

Nativity has on its students. He said that he wished that a school like Nativity had existed when he was growing up in New Bedford, and that he was encouraged that it is now a resource for boys in the city.

Mr. Pemberton urged all of us to stay true to our mission. He stressed the value of hard work, the importance of education, and the power of a



positive attitude. His theme was best summed up by the words to one Nativity student who expressed his wish to become a doctor: "Don't say *I want to be*. Say *I am going to be*." We are grateful for Mr. Pemberton's visit and the impression he made on all of us.

# Financial Commentary

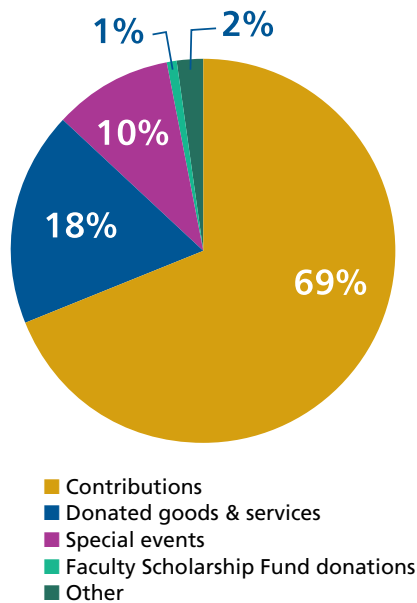
Nativity Preparatory New Bedford continued to grow during fiscal 2016, ending the year with a healthy increase in Program spending. This resulted in a modest shortfall compared to support and revenue.

Total operating expenses are moving steadily past \$1 million per year, support and revenue of about \$1,078,000 includes a single foundation multi-year gift providing \$50 thousand in funding for fiscal

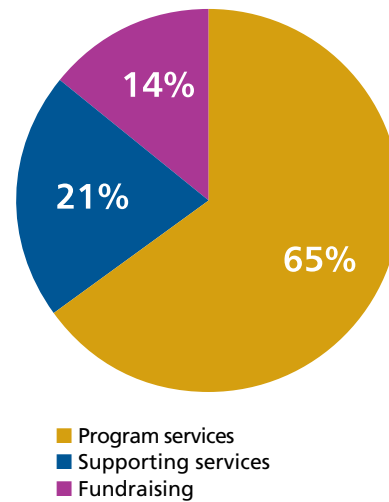
year 2017. (Nonprofit accounting principles require us to record income in the year funds are raised, not in the year designated for use.)
